Ten practical steps to greener beaches and satisfied tourists!

The Greening Cyprus
Beaches **free handbook** was
lanched on 24th of April at
the Filoxenia conference
centre in Nicosia by the
Cyprus Tourism Organisation
(CTO), the Cyprus
Sustainable Tourism Initiative
(CSTI) and the UK-based
charity the Travel Foundation.

The free handbook includes tried and tested ideas to protect natural beach assets and boost visitor satisfaction levels.

The Handbook is a guide for all local authorities, beachfront businesses and property owners who are interested in replicating the successful pilots which ran last year at Fig Tree Bay and Nissi Beach.

The results of those pilots, also published, show beach user satisfaction increased by 9% and 19% respectively following improvements such as promoting recycling and growing native plants.

Other ideas which proved

effective in the pilot include providing a safe drinking water fountain to reduce plastic bottle waste, installing bike racks to encourage cycling, and involving local residents, school children, businesses and holiday makers in beach litter clean-ups.



The handbook is available free of charge from the CSTI in both Greek and English. It provides practical tips, case studies and information on ten categories including sand and water quality, vegetation and planting, 'green' signage and facilities, locally sourced food and drink, and informing and educating the public. It is part of a package of support offered by the CSTI and the

CTO for those who are interested in greening their local beach.

Minimum sustainable standards for the Cyprus Hotel Industry

On April 25th, the Guidelines Manual for meeting the Cyprus Tourism Organisation Minimum standards for sustainability in hotel establishments was presented to the CTO inspectors with the aim to be adopted by the hotel industry. The purpose of this project is to introduce a simple set of minimum environmental and social standards which will become part of the quality

standards. This will assist
Cyprus in integrating
sustainability principles
consistently across the
tourism industry. It will help
hotels to operate more
efficiently, cost effectively
and act more responsibly.
This will enable hotels to
progress towards some of the
standards required for a
number of different
certification schemes, such as
Travelife (supported by UK

Tour Operators). In addition the future mandatory adoption of the minimum sustainable standards from the hotel industry will also serve as a unique marketing tool for the CTO and provide a significant competitive advantage for the island.

This coming September training workshops will be available for all hoteliers in every region!

Participation in the watermelon festival in Frenaros

The 7th Pancyprian Cultural Watermelon Festival in Frenaros was successfully held on July 5th. The community of Frenaros is among the first villages of watermelon production in the whole of Cyprus, making the product the trade mark of the community.

The festival was held under the auspices of the Minister of Agriculture, Natural Resources and Environment, Mr. Nikos Kougialis and was dedicated to Social Solidarity.

All guests were able to offer dry food in order to support the Frenaros Community Food Bank and the Famagusta Coordinating Council of Volunteerism.

The Cyprus Sustainable Tourism Initiative supported the effort of the Frenaros community to promote local products.

CSTI was present with a kiosk at the entrance of the stadium informing visitors about the village route booklets of the area offering free booklets to those interested in exploring the real Cyprus.

Visitors had the opportunity to try sweets, liqueurs and watermelon juice while learning about arts, crafts and local customs of the area. The CSTI offered the amount of 150 euro to the community council of Frenaros supporting local charity organizations.

These activities enhance the local culture and support the local society and economy.
